Reported on activities of the MTC Policy Advisory Council, of which she is a member representing the disabled community of Napa County.

Stated that throughout the bay area, Napa County is beginning to be recognized as a priority conservation area, due to our eper space and agricultural priorities and policies, and as such discussions are taking place with other agricultural communities on efforts to secure to ad and other types of funding so that projects can be funded. If the targer counties will take on more of the housing allocations, then it is likely that they will also be allocated a larger portion of transportation funding.

Reported that this month, MTC will be considering operating assistance of \$1.4M for Napa county, as well as, in tuly the Transit Development Act (TDA) funds for the transit center will be up for consideration.

to the County of Napa payroll system. The approved action resulted in a one-time increase in payroll expenses (sick leave) of up to \$20,000 for FY 10/11.

Board action authorized removal of items identified as obsolete, non-repairable, missing, disposed, or sold from the fixed assets inventory. The approved action had no impact on the General Fund: NCTPA's Fixed Assets was reduced by \$2,658,746.27.

The engineers estimate for the project is \$5,071,000 (which includes a 10% contingency) plus an additional \$500,000 for the photovoltaic array to power the facility. The ICTPA has an unencumbered budget of \$7,635,000 available for the project. In addition to the construction, staff will bring forth a construction management contract from one of our on-call engineering firms at a stimated cost of 10-12% of the construction value. Additionally, there will be a small contract with the design firm for RFI's (Request for formation) on various design aspects that may required arification or approval for equals requests.

Potential Napa Shuttle Service Improvements

Staff reviewed the existing Napa Shuttle Service schedule, ridership, and the financial analysis of potential service improvements Options 1, 2 and 3 shown below. Board action approved Option 3 which increases the Napa Shuttle Service to 3 days/week, 6hours/day for an annual increase in cost of \$30,165.
