


Our seat signs just got an upgrade!




Tyler's favorite parts of the job are working with people (both his coworkers and the community), and working in the Napa Valley.










Total Ridership Change: Shuttles




Local Service Passengers per Revenue Hr (Weekdays)






2nd Qtr 20/21 Regional Service Passengers per Revenue Hour (Weekdays)
